

SINGER MACHINE No. 78-1

LOCK STITCH, COMBINED NEEDLE
AND UPPER FEEDS



Machine No. 78-1 has the central bobbin, oscillating shuttle and link take-up; it has a clear space on bed of 101/8 inches from needle to base of arm and is easily capable of a sustained speed of 1600 stitches per minute in binding, cording, welting and braiding, also straight stitching. It is especially adapted for awnings, mattresses, tents, sails, heavy gloves and mittens, harness and saddlery work, carriage trimming, cushion making, and many other articles in cloth and leather.

This machine has the so called **needle feed** mechanism by which the upper and under pieces of material having uneven or adhesive surfaces are moved forward with exact uniformity, and therefore come out even at the ends, if of the same length; this mechanism consists of the needle and an upper feeding foot acting in unison; in operation, the needle descends into the material, the feeding foot at the same time descending upon the surface of the material, both then move forward carrying the material precisely the length of the stitch desired; the presser foot then descends upon the material and holds it firmly while the needle and feeding foot rise and return to position for the following stitch; there is no under feed and the material moves upon a smooth throat plate.

This machine also has the combined advantages of alternating pressers in passing readily over rough, adhesive or uneven surfaces, and of a needle feed in turning the material so as to produce stitches of the same length upon short right or left hand curves and straight seams.

ATTACHMENTS

The binders, hemmers, corders, braiders, etc., furnished for use with Machine No. 78-1 are easily fastened in position on the machine so as to secure correct relation to the feeding and lifting presser feet, and these feet are so shaped as to produce the best results in the appearance and durability of the work.

Binders are made as hereafter described and illustrated for use with and upon different materials, for straight or curved edges, and with braid, woven or other binding. The binding is carried evenly on the upper and under sides of the material and the action of the needle and feeding foot prevents it from slipping away from the edge while stitching, causing it to be fastened firmly to the material at the proper distance from the edge.


Perfect parallel cording is produced by the action of the presser feet specified, with or without the assistance of the edge guide; a row of stitching is first made and the action of the feeding foot keeps the cord close up while putting in the succeeding ones.

Hemming in light leather, canvas, or lighter woven fabrics is perfectly done without difficulty, and plain stitching is rapidly performed with stitches that do not vary in length whether on straight or curved seams.

Instructions for Ordering Binding Attachments


It will be noticed in the following illustrations of binding attachments that the binding tube is detachable from the shank, so that tubes can be furnished to order for any width of binding. It is, therefore, absolutely essential when ordering a binding tube or binder, to send with the order a sample of the goods to be bound, showing exactly how the work is to be done; also at least one yard of the binding to be used. Thus the folding tube can be made so as to fit exactly the thickness and width of the binding to be used, and perfect results will be obtained.

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

The folder for this binder can be furnished for any size of worsted braid regularly manufactured; the sizes used for awning binding are Nos. 49, 53, 65, 73 or 85, and each folder is stamped with the number of the braid for which it is made. Folders of different sizes can be used upon the same shank. If the number of the braid or binding is not known it is necessary, to prevent delay, that a sample of the braid to be used should be sent with the order for the binder.




Binder No. 36234 (Actual Size) for Awnings


































