


Machine No. 42-1

Machines of Class 42 are especially adapted for stitching medium weight leather and the heavier woven fabrics. They are used in the manufacture of leather cushions, tops, curtains, etc., for automobiles, and are also largely used in the manufacture of traveling bags, sword belts, blanketing, awnings, tarpaulins, trunk covers, tents, matting, rugs, wagon covers and similar work.

Articles of fairly large size can readily be stitched on these machines, there being a clear working space of 10½ inches at the right of the needle. The shuttles have bobbins of large thread carrying capacity.

The machines can be operated on power tabling or on foot power stands. If it is desired to operate a machine on a foot power stand and no number is specified on the order, Table No. 5423 and Stand No. 25226 will be furnished, an extra charge being made.

A large variety of attachments can be furnished with the machines for several descriptions of work including binding, cording, piping, etc., and when attachments are required, samples showing the finished product should be sent with the order.

Following are descriptions of the different varieties of Machines of Class 42:

Machine No. 42-1, for leather, has drop feed at the left of the needle, a roller presser and central bobbin shuttle and can be operated up to the speed of 400 stitches per minute.

Machine No. 42-2, for cloth, has drop feed on both sides of the needle, a hinged presser foot and central bobbin shuttle. Speed 400.

Machine No. 42-3, for cloth, has drop feed on both sides of the needle, a vibrating presser and central bobbin shuttle. Speed 400.

Machine No. 42-4, for leather, has drop feed at the left of the needle, a roller presser, and long beak cylinder shuttle. Speed 1000.

Machine No. 42-5, for stitching automobile and carriage tops, curtains, cushions, wagon covers, horse blankets and heavy textiles, has drop feed at the left of the needle, alternating pressers and long beak cylinder shuttle. Speed 1000.

Machine No. 42-6, for leather, has drop feed on both sides of the needle, vibrating presser and central bobbin shuttle. Speed 400.

Machine No. 42-7, for sewing heavy textiles, has drop feed at the left of the needle, vibrating presser and long beak cylinder shuttle. Speed 1000.

Machine No. 42-8, for stitching awnings, sails, tarpaulins, trunk covers, etc., has drop feed on both sides of the needle, alternating pressers and central bobbin shuttle. Speed 400.
