

Machine No. 16-41

Machine No. 16-41 is adapted for sewing cloth or light or medium weight leather and is extensively used for binding clothing, sandals, shoe tongues, rubber coats, mattresses, lap robes, carpets, gun covers, automobile and carriage trimming and a great variety of other articles, the binders being furnished at an extra charge when ordered. A sample of the binding and the material to be bound should accompany orders for binders.

The machine has one needle and an oscillating shuttle and makes the lock stitch. Large work is readily handled as there is a clear working space of 10½ inches at the right of the needle.

The machine can be driven by mechanical power up to the speed of 1400 stitches per minute and it can also be operated by foot power. When it is desired to operate the machine by foot power, treadle stand No. 25265 and table No. 5401 can be furnished, an extra charge being made for this equipment.

An excellent grade of work is accomplished on this machine as it is equipped with what is known as alternating pressers, consisting of two presser feet. One foot assists the feeding mechanism in bringing the work forward while the other foot lifts and descends at alternate periods to hold the work. Stitching of fabrics of uneven thicknesses is therefore perfectly accomplished and two or more plies of material are fed uniformly.

The efficient alternating pressers of this machine especially adapt it for binding various articles, the binding material being carried evenly on the upper and under sides of the fabric being bound.

Edge cording is also very satisfactorily accomplished on this machine by using Corder No. 35034. Strip folding is also efficiently accomplished by using Strip Folder No. 26814. Both attachments will be supplied when ordered, an extra charge being made.
