In addition to being the Head of Special Collections, Ronald Brashear also serves as the Curator of Science and Technology Rare Books in the Smithsonian Institution Libraries' Dibner Library of the History of Science & Technology. Brashear came to the Smithsonian in 1998 from the Huntington Library, where he was Curator of History of Science, Technology, and Medicine, and Institutional Archivist for ten years.

Brashear received his B.A. and M.S. from the University of Louisville and spent four years at Johns Hopkins University studying for his Ph.D. in the history of science. His research interests include the history of astronomy and he has recently co-authored the book, *Star Struck: One Thousand Years of the Art and Science of Astronomy* (2001) and contributed articles for *History of Astronomy* (1997), *Instruments of Science* (1998), *American National Biography* (1999), and the *Oxford Companion to United States History* (2001).
