Head, back, wings, and tail, light blue ash-colour; throat and under tail coverts white; cervical collar, breast, belly, and thighs, pale rufous; under parts of the wings, and the base of all the plumage, white. Wings rounded; the fourth quill longest; the first, half the length of the fourth; shafts black; tail slightly rounded, consisting of twelve feathers, the colour lightest beneath; shafts black above, white beneath; bill and claws blue-black; cere, eyelids, and legs, rich gamboge-yellow; irides orange.

The female does not differ from the male except in size, being much larger, and in having the under tail coverts pale rufous instead of white.

*Young.* Head and back umber, the feathers edged with ferruginous, and barred with white, the latter scarcely visible without raising the feathers; throat white; breast tawny-white, each of the feathers having a central line, and terminal spot of umber; flanks barred with umber; thighs tawny, with irregular bars of pale ferruginous; wings umber, with darker bars; beneath tawny, barred with umber; shafts dusky beneath, brown above; tail umber on the upper surface, whitish beneath, edged and tinged with ferruginous; twelve dark bars cross the whole, but are palest on the two inner and two outer feathers; shafts brown above, white beneath; bill and claws black; cere, eyelids, and legs, pale olive green; irides brown. Young females agree with the above description of the male.
