

## 2. *Enyo danum*.

*Hab.* GUATEMALA<sup>2</sup>; PANAMA, Chiriqui (*mus. Staudinger*).—ANTILLES, San Domingo<sup>3</sup>; ECUADOR (*mus. D.*); PERU<sup>3</sup>; BOLIVIA<sup>3</sup>; GUIANA, Surinam<sup>1</sup>.

This is a well-marked species, easily distinguished from its allies by the pale yellow patch on the abdominal margin of the secondaries.

## 3. *Enyo gorgon*.

*Hab.* MEXICO (*mus. Oxf.*); BRITISH HONDURAS, river Sarstoon (*Blancaneaux*); NICARAGUA<sup>3</sup>; PANAMA, Chiriqui (*Arcé, mus. D.*).—ECUADOR (*mus. D.*); GUIANA, Surinam<sup>1 2</sup>; BRAZIL<sup>4</sup>.

## ALEURON.

*Aleuron*, Boisdual, Lép. Guat. p. 71 (1870).

Mr. Butler places three species in this genus.

## 1. *Aleuron chloroptera*.

*Hab.* GUATEMALA<sup>3</sup>; HONDURAS<sup>2</sup> (*mus. Brit.*); NICARAGUA, Chontales (*Belt*); PANAMA, Chiriqui (*Ribbé*).—GUIANA, Cayenne<sup>4</sup>; BRAZIL<sup>1</sup>.

A wide-ranging southern species, of which I have as yet seen only three Central-American specimens.

## 2. *Aleuron iphis*.

*Hab.* PANAMA, Chiriqui (*Arcé, mus. D., Ribbé*).—GUIANA, Surinam<sup>2 3</sup>; AMAZONS<sup>3</sup>; BRAZIL<sup>1</sup>.

I have only seen two specimens of this species from Central America; and none has been as yet sent from any locality north of Panama.
