WHILST the present volume was passing through the press several additional forms of "Biologia" Acridiidae came to light. The most important of these is *Taxiarchus septentrionalis*, Bruner [Entom. News, xvi. pp. 313 & 314 (Dec. 1905)], which adds another subfamily, the Proscopinæ, to the region covered by this work. It was captured by M. A. Carriker, Jr., at Pozo Azul, Costa Rica, who found both sexes.
