

*Conopholis mexicana* Gray. in Swats. Proc. Acad.

Distinguished from *C. americana* by its longer and more rigid lanceolate acuminate scales, the calyx less deeply toothed, and the corolla larger (8 lines long). — In the Sierra Madre, south of Saltillo (996) and at Solera Coahuila, growing at the foot of oaks; 4693 Payson & Palmer. It has been previously collected in New Mexico in the Organ Mountains (1461 Wright), and in the Santa Magdalena Mountains (G. Mearns), and in the mountains of Arizona (Rueby), and it is probably the more common species in Mexico. The plant figured by Endlicher (Iconogr. t. 81) for *C. americana* is *C. mexicana*, probably from Andrieux's collection.
